Irish History # 67 - Come Out Ye Black and Tans

Did you hear the music of Irish folk legends - the Wolfe Tones - in person? Back in the day, as part of their east coast tour during the season of St. Patrick's Day festivities, the group performed a show at what was then Cryan's Pub on 16th Avenue in South Belmar. The Wolfe Tones rocked the house.

If you were lucky enough to be in attendance, you heard them sing *Come Out Ye Black and Tans* – one of their great rebel songs.

“I was born on a Dublin street where the royal drums did beat, And those loving English feet tramped all over us,

And each and every night when my father came home tight, He'd invite the neighbors outside with this chorus:

Come out ye Black and Tans, come out and fight me like a man, Show your wife how you won medals down in Flanders,

Tell them how the IRA made you run like hell away, From the green and lovely lanes of Killashandra.”

The song, first released in 1972, rose to the top of the iTunes charts in Ireland and Great Britain this month. Why? Because of the controversy surrounding the Irish government's proposed commemoration of the Royal Irish Constabulary (RIC) police force and Dublin Metropolitan Police (DMP) force.

Before looking at the commemoration event and what it means, it may be good to recall who the Black and Tans were. They were former British soldiers from World War I, who were recruited to serve as constables in the RIC. Their name stems from the khaki trousers and black jackets they wore. Winston Churchill's decision to send them and the Auxiliary Division (former British officers from World War I) to Ireland was seen as a desperate attempt to defeat the Irish rebellion which intensified in 1920.

In January 1920, new security laws led to mass arrests of Irish republican leaders. Unimpressed, republican guerillas burned police barracks, attacked patrols and killed police. In addition to violence, there was intimidation. “Police and their families were shunned and threatened.” Merchants refused to serve them. The RIC was unable to respond with a counter-insurgency strategy. Many left the force.

The purpose of British reinforcements was to bolster the RIC and suppress disorder. Their job was to restore law and order. What they left in their wake was anything but. In reality, they were not a police force but a paramilitary force unchecked by military law, lacking military discipline and full of brutality fueled by the fear they caused.

A Black and Tans commander, Lt. Colonel Gerald Smyth, addressed recruits as follows: “Should the order ‘Hands Up’ not be immediately obeyed, shoot and shoot with effect. If the person approaching the patrol carry their hands in their pockets, or are in any way suspicious looking, shoot them down. You may make mistakes occasionally and innocent persons may be shot, but that cannot be helped, and you are bound to get the right parties some time. The more you shoot, the better I will like you, and I assure you no policeman will get into trouble shooting any man.” This was the Black and Tans' approach to law enforcement when they arrived in Ireland in March.

A member of the RIC, who was present for the speech, briefed Michael Collins. Smyth was marked for assassination by the IRA, and he was shot to death in Cork.

In a savage “reign of terror,” Black and Tans chose not to distinguish between republican rebels and civilians. They looted businesses, burned towns, and abused and assassinated prisoners. One example of their wanton destruction occurred in Cork, where they sacked five acres of Cork city center and burned down much of central Cork. In response to republican activity, they engaged in reprisals and extra-judicial killings. They formed police death squads to go after republicans. One of their victims was Tomas MacCurtain, Lord Mayor of Cork and Commander of the IRA's 1st Cork Brigade. Two hours after a member of the RIC was shot in Tipperary, MacCurtain's house was stormed by police who shot and killed him in his pajamas in the bedroom.

Reprisals and atrocities were committed by both sides. The IRA punished what it considered “illegitimate acts of warfare” by British enemies. Republicans took hostages and shot them in response to executions of their compatriots. When the British ordered all IRA men captured with weapons to be shot, Collins responded by instructing the IRA to shoot British security forces captured whether armed or not. There were no prisoners of war.

Great Britain viewed members of the IRA as criminals and murderers, not members of an army engaged in a legitimate war. Contrarily, the IRA saw itself as fighting lawfully for the freedom and independence that was a nation's right.

During the War of Independence, public sentiment sided with nationhood and the IRA. The thuggery and brutality of the Black and Tans outraged and inflamed the populace, who despised and condemned them. Merciless cruelty was the Black and Tans' lasting legacy.

As part of the Decade of Centenaries program (1912-23), the Irish government announced an event commemorating more than 500 members of the RIC and DMP killed during the War of Independence. The commemoration was to be held at Dublin Castle, once the administrative seat of Great Britain's rule over Ireland. Justice Minister Charles Flanagan said a somber and solemn commemoration was not a celebration of the police force; rather, it was "an acknowledgment of the historical importance" of the RIC. He also said reconciliation will only be achieved through "mutual respect of the different traditions on the island," and this event was a step in that direction.

Fierce opposition to the announcement developed immediately. Dublin City councilors voted to call holding the event "obscene." Sinn Fein rejected it, as did mayors of Dublin, Cork, Galway, Clare and Waterford. Some protested "commemorating an institution that does not have a good history in Ireland and took the side of the Black and Tans during the War of Independence," noting in particular what happened in Cork. Others said it was "historical revisionism gone too far," noting the RIC was on the losing side in the war and the wrong side of history. Some decried treating the struggle for Irish independence as morally equivalent to the effort of a colonial power to suppress it, while others called the event an "affront to generations of patriots who struggled to end centuries of imperial tyranny."

Reacting to the outcry, Flanagan responded that the "vast majority of Irish people who served as army and police officers did so with honor and integrity," and he called the event an opportunity to remember them. He added, "we should not seek to airbrush these people from our history"

due to intolerance. "So many . . . Irish families share this complex history and these facts should be explored and acknowledged as all threads of our history, within families and as a nation, make us who are today as a people," he said.

Nevertheless, the government postponed the commemoration until one can be organized "that is inclusive and fully respectful of all the traditions and memories on this island." Taoiseach Leo Varadkar called the postponement a setback for reconciliation and a united Ireland. He lamented the false claims and misrepresentations made by some of the event's opponents. He said, a united Ireland "must be one that recognizes our shared history" and the fact that one million people on the island identify as unionist. He felt the reaction to the proposal showed we as an Irish people are not ready for that.

What it does show is just how raw emotions are as issues related to the War of Independence are debated 100 years later, and just how long a journey the island of Ireland must travel to achieve genuine reconciliation. It may be that honoring the RIC, which implies approval, is a step too far in reconciling differences. But fully recognizing and understanding the RIC's role in Irish history is a positive step toward burying the hatchet and letting go of the bitter past. Acknowledgment fosters reconciliation.


