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Irish History #84 Preparing for Peace Talks

In August 1921, the Cabinet passed a motion changing Eamon de Valera's title as President of the Dail Eireann (Irish Parliament) to "President of the Republic who shall also be Prime Minister." De Valera took the title to mean that he should no longer be looked upon as a party leader but as the representative of the nation. In other words, he felt he was "the symbol" of the Republic.

The motion also restructured the Cabinet into the Prime Minister and six "Secretaries of State." In addition to de Valera, the six were: Arthur Griffith, Michael Collins, Austin Stack, Cathal Brugha, Robert Barton and W.T. Cosgrave. (Cosgrave would become leader of the Irish Free State after the death of Collins.)

Once he was named President of the Irish Republic, de Valera announced that he would not attend the substantive peace negotiations in London. Collins argued de Valera, as head of the government and the person who had been meeting with Prime Minister David Lloyd George, should go. The Cabinet Secretaries voted on the issue. They split 3-to-3. Collins, Griffith and Cosgrave for de Valera going; Stack, Brugha and Barton against.

De Valera cast the deciding vote in favor of his staying home. He did not want his name attached to what was surely going to happen; that is, compromises would have to be made during the talks. Like a "soldier," Collins accepted the defeat of his motion for de Valera to attend, and his appointment by de Valera as second-in-command of the negotiating team.

Going to London was dangerous for Collins. Afterall, he had led the fight for Irish freedom. But it was de Valera's way of setting him up for failure. De Valera worried Collins would accept Dominion status for Ireland in the negotiations as a first step to full independence. (In the end, that is what happened.) De Valera wanted to stay out of the settlement fray until negotiations were concluded, at which time he planned to rescue and resolve the treaty with his vague "External Association" concept. He thought this maneuver would assure his "political future as leader of a Republican party" in Ireland.

Although not known at the time, the 3-to-3 Cabinet vote on whether de Valera should attend was a harbinger of things to come. It symbolized how republicans would split after the Anglo-Irish Treaty was signed and passed by the Dail. De Valera, Stack and Brugha were on the anti-Treaty side, while Collins and Griffith were on the pro-Treaty side. The anti-pro Treaty split was bitter, and it led to the deadly Irish Civil War.

Before the peace settlement conference commenced, Lloyd George once again made clear to de Valera that the talks were premised on de Valera's acceptance of certain pre-conditions. First, Irish representatives were not negotiating on behalf of "an independent and sovereign State." Second, Ireland was going to remain part of the British Commonwealth with allegiance to the throne.

De Valera prepared a "Draft Treaty A" in August for the plenipotentiaries (Irish delegation to formal peace talks) to take with them to London. (See Chapter 83). This draft treaty addressed issues related to trade, finance, national defense, the Crown and the Empire (i.e., Ireland's status), and Ulster. The draft treaty was in the form of a "memorandum," which de Valera had prepared for Lloyd George in July "but had decided not to send."

De Valera also prepared but did not release a "Draft Treaty B", which "allegedly" contained the terms Ireland was prepared to accept "but in fact was intended for use as propaganda should the talks break down." Neither draft treaty was in a final form. Thus, according to Collins, confusion surrounded the exact terms of settlement the plenipotentiaries were supposed to gain. This was a terrible position for any negotiator trying to reach a beneficial settlement. And it hurt the Irish team of novice negotiators, who were going-up against Lloyd George and his British team of experienced and skilled negotiators.

Reaching agreement on language dealing with trade, finance and defense was not expected to be difficult. The 1920 Government of Ireland Act created the province of Northern Ireland within the United Kingdom. (See Chapter 78). As for Ulster, gaining the "essential unity" of the entire island (i.e., north and south) was critical for two of the plenipotentiaries -Griffith and Collins. The British refused to use force to coerce Ulster's re-unification with the South, but were not otherwise opposed to finding some other path that might allow it to happen.

Language dealing with The Crown and the Empire, however, proved to be a major area of disagreement. As Frank Pakenham points out in his book Peace by Ordeal, terms like "Dominion Status, Allegiance to the Crown and Common Citizenship" are provocative, and they engender "passionate loyalties and antipathies in the minds of delegates and peoples."

Despite Lloyd George's admonition, the draft treaty the plenipotentiaries took to London called for Ireland to be recognized as a "sovereign independent state." The parties, however, had to be aware that this was a non-starter. This incomplete draft treaty called upon Great Britain to renounce "all claim to govern or legislate for Ireland," and it stated that Ireland agreed "to become an External Association of the Commonwealth." It also recognized reciprocal rights for Irish and British citizens, but not common citizenship.

In reality, External Association looked a lot like Dominion Status. Under either format, Ireland would be a member of the Commonwealth. But the phrases were matters of principle. They evoked different feelings and meant different things to the parties. To de Valera, External Association meant that Ireland was independent from Great Britain and an equal nation to it. It meant the dream of a Republic would be preserved. To Lloyd George, the phrase meant "imperfect loyalty" to the Crown. He also did not want it to appear as if Ireland had been able to fight its "way out of the Empire." According to Pakenham, the British viewed Dominion Status as "the supreme symbol of unity" with the Crown. The Irish, however, viewed it as subjecting their freedom to British whims. Under Dominion Status, the Irish felt they remained "Britain's children."

The peace talks opened on October 8, 1921. At that point, roughly 2250 had been killed during the Irish War of Independence. Although fighting had ended in the South in July when the truce came into effect, the number of deaths increased because the IRA continued to attack targets in Northern Ireland and because of a pogrom waged against Catholics in Belfast.

A key question throughout the negotiations was whether any practical differences between External Association and Dominion Status made a return to war worth it? Thinking about how many more would die if hostilities resumed made any permanent peace settlement look like it was the best option.

Underlying this question was another significant one. If a return to war was the result of failed negotiations, who was better positioned to win the battle? Collins feared the answer was the British.
