



Irish History #78 Irish History #78 – The Aftermath of Bloody Sunday, and Partition under the Governmentof Ireland Act 1920

On Bloody Sunday morning, Michael Collins had his men hunt down and shoot 19 suspected British intelligence agents in Dublin. Fourteen were killed. Members of the Black and Tans, Auxiliaries and Royal Irish Constabulary gained revenge at Croke Park during the afternoon. British security forces unleashed a barrage of gunfire on unarmed spectators at a Tipperary-Dublin Gaelic football match. Fourteen innocent civilians were killed in a mere 90 seconds.

An effort by British authorities to place blame for the deaths on unidentified gunmen at the match who they claimed fired the first shots was seen as incredible, because they had no evidence to support the allegation. British journalists reported eyewitness accounts that established the security forces were wholly at fault. From America, Eamon de Valera called the British attack on unarmed people a "massacre." De Valera pointed out that: "There is no comparison between the guilt of British soldiers who . . . mow down unoffending civilians as they walk the streets intent upon their ordinary business or attend a football match . . . and Irishmen who kill these British soldiers engaged in an armed campaign of violent aggression against the Irish people's rights."

On one hand, the British suffered the shock of what Collins was able to pull-off; on the other, they faced criticism for fighting the war in a criminal manner. Bloody Sunday forced British authorities to reassess their objectives in Ireland. The expected all-out victory was now suspect, and they began to think more would be gained through political compromise. Prime Minister (PM) David Lloyd George kept the door for compromise open by downplaying the British casualties suffered on Bloody Sunday. He said: "Tragic as the events in Dublin were, they were of no importance. These men were soldiers and took a soldier's risk."

De Valera reevaluated things too. Although he publicly defended Collins' action on Bloody Sunday, he preferred fighting big battles in the open rather than conducting guerilla- warfare attacks in the shadows. De Valera returned to Ireland after Collins arranged safe passage for him on a ship. When de Valera arrived in Dublin, he asked Tom Cullen "how things were going?" Cullen responded "Great! The Big Fellow [Michael Collins] is leading us and everything is going marvelous." De Valera responded: "Big Fellow. We'll see who's the Big Fellow." (See Chapter 65). From then on, de Valera sought to diminish Collins and control the war effort.

After the Versailles peace conference completed the peace treaties officially ending World War I (WWI), government leaders in Great Britain turned their attention to the Home Rule Act of 1914 (the third Home Rule Bill), which had been enacted when the Liberals were in power. Implementation of its provisions creating a home rule parliament in Ireland had been placed on hold during WWI and the ensuing peace process. Unionist objections to Irish home rule were not resolved during this period of the law's dormancy; and the question of what Great Britain would do about Ireland's cry for self-determination also went unanswered. (The 1916 Easter Rising happened in the middle of WWI - See Chapter 51). Winston Churchill may have captured the dilemma best with the following statement after the "Great War" ended. He said: "[T]he mode and thought of men, the whole outlook on affairs, the grouping of parties, all have encountered violent and tremendous changes." Yet we see "the dreary steeples of Fermanagh and Tyrone emerging once again. The integrity of their quarrel [with Great Britain] is one of the few institutions that have been unaltered by the cataclysm which has swept the world."

To placate Unionists, the Conservative government abandoned implementation of the third Home Rule law, and replaced it with what was, in effect, a fourth Home Rule Bill. This bill worked its way through Parliament during 1920. Finally, in December, the Government of Ireland Act - also known as the "Partition Bill" - received royal assent and became law.

The Act created two home rule parliaments: a Northern Ireland Parliament for six counties (Antrim,

Armagh, Down, Fermanagh, Derry, and Tyrone); and a Southern Ireland Parliament for the remaining 26 counties. Ulster Unionists begrudgingly agreed to the new law. Although they preferred direct rule from Westminster, the Northern Ireland Parliament was accepted because it meant Ulster was divorced from the rest of Ireland. Sinn Fein leaders rejected the idea of a home rule parliament and continued the defiant fight for full independence for all of Ireland (i.e., the entire island). Nevertheless, partition was now written into law.

The Freeman's Journal newspaper called the new law the "Dismemberment of Ireland Bill." The Act read in part:

"[T]here shall be established for Southern Ireland a parliament called the parliament of Southern Ireland consisting of his majesty, the senate of Southern Ireland, and the house of commons of Southern Ireland, and there shall be established for Northern Ireland a parliament called the parliament of Northern Ireland . .. Northern Ireland shall consist of the parliamentary counties of Antrim, Armagh, Down, Fermanagh, Londonderry and Tyrone ..." [Government of Ireland Act 1920].

The Act effectively repealed the 1914 Home Rule law from the statute books. The Act gave each parliament the "power to make laws for peace, order and good government" in their respective jurisdictions. However, the supremacy of the Westminster Parliament in London was maintained because neither the Southern nor Northern Parliament had the power to alter any law passed by Westminster.

The Act also called for the creation of a Council of Ireland, comprised of 20 members from each parliament, with authority to issue orders on matters common to both jurisdictions. The Council's purpose was to ensure uniformity and harmony between the two parliaments on those matters, "[w]ith a view to the eventual establishment of a parliament for the whole of Ireland." [Government of Ireland Act 1920]. That is, the peaceful evolution of a single parliament for all of Ireland. That unification, of course, was never achieved, which is why the Irish question in British politics remains unanswered 100 years later despite generations of misery in Ireland's Northeast.

It was unrealistic to expect Sinn Fein to drop its pursuit of self-determination and full independence.

The British government knew only a Republic would satisfy Sinn Fein, and they were not offering that. Therefore, passage of the Act was not a serious attempt to resolve the Irish question. Rather, it was an attempt to assuage Ulster Unionists opposed to the third Home Rule law and lessen their resistance to some other form of home rule.

The Irish War of Independence intensified after Bloody Sunday and throughout the first half of the new year. PM Lloyd George, however, still sought a compromise that would end it and maintain Ireland's union with Great Britain. When King George V opened the Northern Ireland Parliament in Belfast on June 22, 1921, he appealed "to all Irishmen to pause, to stretch out the hand of forbearance and conciliation, to forgive and forget, and to join in making for the land they love a new era of peace, contentment and good will." The King's speech helped PM Lloyd George overcome the hawks in his Cabinet. He followed-up on the King's call for peace and reconciliation by telling Englishmen the King's words should not have been spoken "in vain," and by "sending a public appeal to de Valera suggesting a peace conference." De Valera agreed, and a truce of hostilities was declared on July 11.

De Valera went to London with a delegation; Collins was not part of the group. De Valera and Lloyd George conferred for several days. Northern Ireland's Prime Minister, James Craig, relied on the Northern Ireland Act 1920 to stay away from the nascent peace talks. He said it was up to de Valera and Lloyd George "to come to terms on the area outside of which I am Prime Minister." Afterall, partition was the law. On that point, nothing has changed.
