# Irish History #102

#### A Brief History of the Harp, the Irish National Flag and Their Connection

Sending best wishes to the Jersey Shore Shillelaghs and their families for a La fhéile Pádraig sona daoibh (Happy St. Patrick's Day to you). "May the blessings and love/ Of St. Patrick fall on yourself, on your home/ On your dear ones and all."

For a change of pace from reading about the civil war, this month we will look at the Harp, the Irish National Flag, and how they are connected.

Ireland is the only country that has a musical instrument - the harp - as its national symbol. Many of us are familiar with seeing a harp on a Guinness Stout bottle or can. Because the right-facing harp was trademarked by Guinness in 1876, the Irish Free State was forced to flip the design to a left-facing harp so the harp could be used as the symbol of the new state in 1922. Today, the left-facing harp is emblazoned on the cover of the Eire Ireland-European Union Passport, and it is used on other official documents. But did you know that the harp has been an emblem of Ireland for centuries, and long before the "mud of the River Liffey" (Guinness) recipe was developed.

According to Irish folklore, Brian Boru, the last High King of Ireland (11th century), played the harp. In the 16th century, English King Henry VIII broke with the Pope when his request for a papal annulment was not approved. (Henry went on to have 6 wives.) He received another royal title in 1531, when he was named King of Ireland. In that role, he designated "the harp as [Ireland's] national symbol."

The harp was played for Irish kings and chieftains and at special occasions like "banquets, weddings, and victory celebrations," down through the ages. This gave the instrument a preeminent role in Irish culture. The harp appeared in the works of literary giants, like poet W.B. Yeats and writer James Joyce. Whether played as a solo instrument or accompanying Irish traditional music instruments, those who hear its beautiful musical tones cherish the experience.

During the 18th and 19th centuries, Irish nationalists adopted the harp as "a symbol of resistance against British rule." During the 1798 Irish Rebellion, known as "The Year of the French," Wolfe Tone and the United Irishmen marched under a green flag depicting a golden harp. They gave the flag a motto: "It is new strung and shall be heard." Thomas Moore wrote the melancholic melody and lyrics to "The Minstrel Boy" in

1813. In the song, the harp represents the devastation of Irish culture under British rule.

"The Minstrel-Boy to the war is gone, In the ranks of death you'll find him; His father's sword he has girded on, And his wild harp slung behind him. "Land of song!" said the warrior-bard, "Tho' all the world betrays thee, One sword, at least, thy rights shall guard,

One faithful harp shall praise thee!"

Later, the green flag with the golden harp became the banner for the Fenians and the Irish Republican Brotherhood. When this flag was flown during the 1916 Easter Rising, it was called the Green Harp Flag.

Next month will mark the Rising's 107th anniversary.

The Green Harp Flag was prominent during the Easter Rising. It flew over Liberty Hall in Dublin. Liberty Hall served as the headquarters of James Connolly and the Irish Citizen Army, and it was where the "Proclamation of the Irish Republic" was printed. The Green Harp Flag also flew at the General Post Office during Easter week.

Another flag had a prominent role in the Rising. That was the tricolor flag of green, white, and orange. It too was flown at the General Post Office, and it flew above Padraig Pearse when he read the "Proclamation of the Irish Republic" on Easter Monday.

For a short time, it could be said that Ireland had two national flags - the Green Harp Flag and the Irish Tricolor. Both flags symbolized the Irish people's desire for freedom and independence. After the Rising, however, the tricolor flag captured the Irish people's imagination "as the banner of [a] new revolutionary Ireland." The Irish Republican Army adopted the tricolor as its flag during the Irish War of Independence.

Soon, the tricolor officially became the Irish National Flag. First, as previously stated, it was the symbol of the Irish Free State. Second, when the Irish Constitution (Bunreacht nah Eireann) was passed in 1937, Article 7 stated: "The national flag of Ireland is the tricolor green, white and orange." This is the flag we see proudly flown today at the clubhouse and at many Jersey shore residences.

The green vertical strip is representative of Catholics, and the orange vertical strip is representative of


Protestants. (The color green was associated with the shamrock and St. Patrick, while orange was associated with William of Orange's 1690 victory over Catholic King James II at the Battle of the Boyne.) The white strip in the middle represents a longed-for, peaceful union between the two religions.

It is worth noting the origins of the Irish Tricolor. In 1848, French revolutionaries overthrew King Louis Phillipe I. Members of the Young Irelander nationalist groups went to France to congratulate the rebels. There, Thomas Francis Meagher, a Young Irelander leader, was "presented with an Irish tricolor woven out of French silk" as a gift. (Meagher later served in the Union Army during the U.S. Civil War as a Brigadier General. He commanded the Irish Brigade during many bloody civil war battles, including Antietam.) After he returned to Ireland, Meagher flew the flag for the first time in Waterford City. He hung it out of the second-floor window of the Wolfe Tone Club. Addressing the crowd on the street below, he said: "The white in the center signifies a lasting truce between the orange and the green, and I trust that beneath its folds the hand of the Irish Protestant and the Irish Catholic may be clasped, in generous and heroic brotherhood."

The tricolor flies at Gaelic Athletic Association events in all four provinces, including Ulster. Nationalists on both sides of the border view it as the island's national flag. How this impacts the peaceful union of orange and green in the north, where flags and emblems are weighty components of community heritage, is unclear. But let us continue to fervently hope that we get to see Meagher's eloquent pleafor Irish Protestant and Irish Catholic hands to clasp in brotherhood - become a reality in a united Ireland. There's lots more work to do to make that happen.

Treasurer - Lauren Kolar - handles all financials for the band and the overall financial health of the band.

Secretary - Scott MacDonald - handles meeting minutes, maintains band corporate seal, tracks attendance and other band related paperwork.

Drum Major - Mark Mastowski - assists the Pipe Major in overall presentation of the band at performances/events. An appointed position by the E-board. The Drum Major leads the band in parades.


